# HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE COLLECTION CALENDAR 2023

Garbage bags should be placed in the town designated garbage bags and left in the collection area (ごみステーション) designated in each area by 8 am on the day of collection. Please make sure that garbage bags are placed neatly with "ward name, group, name" facing forward.

\*Be sure not to put out your trash on the previous day or late at night considering traffic situation or your neighbours.

\*It is illegal to take away garbage that has been left at garbage collection points (garbage stations). If you discover someone doing so, please report them to the police.

Collection day Segregation	<b>Trash collection day</b> (*Trash is collected on the national holidays.)
<b>Burnable trash</b>	<b>Every Monday and Thursday</b> The last collection day of the year is December 28th (Thursday). The first collection day of the year is January 4th (Thursday).
<b>Plastic trash</b>	<b>Every Wednesday</b> The last collection day of the year is December 27th (Wednesday). The first collection day of the year is January 3rd (Wednesday).

## How to separate and dispose garbage (Please indicate your full name, group and district name on your trash bag.)

Burnable				Items to be disassembled (If you cannot break it down, please bring it directly to the incineration plant.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You need to put out up to <b>5 trash bags</b> at one time.</li> <li>Drain the organic garbage of water, put in the town-designated bag and knot the opening.</li> <li>Please make efforts to reduce the quantity of kitchen garbage by starting a compost or using garbage disposers. (*There is a subsidy system)</li> <li>Wooden products such as branches, bamboos, chests of drawers, etc., should be cut into pieces not exceeding 50 cm in length and 5 cm in diameter at the longest point, bound together with twine, paper string or rope, and accompanied by a piece of paper or tape with your name written on it.</li> <li>We require residents to personally bring in items that are more than 5cm in diameter or consist of more than six bundles. (*One bundle should have a maximum diameter of about 40cm and a maximum of five bundles can be disposed of at one time)</li> <li>Plastic and metal parts should be removed before taking out. If metal parts cannot be removed, sort it as a non-burnable waste.</li> <li>Objects that cannot be used as recyclable resources, such as dust cloth, kitchen cloth, scraps of cloth, cut underwear, socks with holes, wool, etc.</li> <li>Floorcloth, pieces of cloth, waste pieces from cutting cloth, clipped underwear, socks with holes, stockings, woolen yarn which are not recyclable garbage.</li> <li>Bend objects with sharp ends such as skewers and toothpicks into two.</li> <li>Note: Various hygiene products (toothbrushes, PCR test kits, etc.)</li> </ul>	
Plastic trash					<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Containers must be empty before taking out. Wash them with water or wipe before putting in a trash bag. • Caps should be removed.</li> <li>Supermarket bags/snack bags/plastic bags/Snack/deli wrapping.</li> <li>Cups for pudding, ice cream or yogurt, lunch box and food tray, Packs.</li> <li>Tubes for toothpaste, horseradish, mayonnaise or cosmetics.</li> <li>Plastic lids or caps, styrofoam box and buffering agent, packing material.</li> <li>Bottles for seasonings, detergent, shampoo, and several kinds of packs. (Take off taps and caps)</li> <li>Small containers or bags for instant noodle or lunch box, and films.</li> <li>Plastic coated aluminum pouches of pouch-packed food (such as curry, Chinese bowl, and beef bowl, etc.).</li> </ul>	
Non-burnable					<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Put glass products (cup, dish, flower vase, plate glass, etc) in a bag for trash.</li> <li>Write your name on the bag to be put out.</li> <li>Toys (Try to separate metallic parts). Remove batteries.</li> <li>Remove the metal parts if you can before throwing away.</li> <li>Aluminum foils, aluminum plates for pan fried udon, etc.</li> </ul>	
Recyclable resources					<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Remove batteries from electrical items.</li> <li>Aluminum bowl inside rice cooker should be classified as a recyclable resource.</li> <li>TVs, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers, air-conditioners, and moped bikes are not collected by the neighborhood, so please do not leave them at garbage collection points.</li> <li>Take off the easily removable plastic and metal, and bring it out to the other plastic materials and recyclable resources.</li> <li>Write your name on paper, and attach to disposable items.</li> <li>Futons, Kotatsu futons, and mattresses should be rolled as small as possible and tied with strings (plastic strings, etc.).</li> <li>Legless chairs and beds (including mattresses) larger than 50 cm in length, width and height shall be self-hauled to the incineration plant.</li> <li>Shorten vinyl-coated steel products to less than 2m.</li> <li>Put empty cans (with less than 1 liter) in a specified basket. Take out the cans and put them in the basket.</li> <li>Spray cans should be used up and then placed in an "empty can container" without making holes.</li> <li>If you cannot finish using it, bring it into the burning site.</li> <li>Kerosene heaters must be emptied. The bottom of the main unit is also to be emptied.</li> <li>Dispose of umbrellas after removing the cloth, plastic, and so on.</li> <li>Paint cans must be emptied. (Paint residue is burnable.) (Cans are recyclable waste.)</li> <li>As for cans, use up the contents and clean them slightly with water.</li> <li>Bottles should be disposed of after the contents have been fully used up (removed) and rinsed clean.</li> <li>Remove caps from bottles. (Caps must be sorted to recycle or plastic trash by the materials).</li> <li>Separate bottle color into transparent, brown and others. (Put them without bag)</li> <li>Sort cosmetic bottles into colorless, brown, and others, and place into container. (Do not put in bag)</li> <li>Inner type caps are acceptable just like they are.</li> <li>*Please place "miscellaneous paper" in recyclable garbage.</li> <li>*Categorize used paper into cardboard boxes, newspapers, magazines and miscellaneous paper, and paper cartons such as milk cartons. Tie each firmly with paper strings.</li> <li>*Paper cartons such as milk cartons with inner coating (juice cartons, alcohol cartons, etc.) may also be disposed.</li> <li>*The newspaper inserts along with newspapers with paper strings and dispose.</li> <li>*Place "miscellaneous recyclable paper" such as paper bags, wrapping paper, catalogs, and envelopes in a dedicated container.</li> <li>*Collect small pieces of "miscellaneous recyclable paper" in a paper bag that has paper handles and when it is full, tie the handles together and dispose of it.</li> <li>You can also tie the entire paper bag vertically with paper string and place it in a bag dedicated for the garbage station.</li> <li>*Small "miscellaneous recyclable paper" should be placed in town designated trash bags and taken out.</li> <li>*Please place clothes in plastic bags and prevent them from getting wet.</li> <li>After using up the contents, crush the container.</li> <li>Peel off the label on the bottle.</li> <li>PET bottle caps and labels should be removed and disposed of as "plastics (plastic packaging containers)". Remove stickers, such as advertisements, and separate the waste into different types.</li> <li>* Limited to those products with PET1 indication sign (♻️).</li> <li>Put the batteries in the 18-liter can with "カンデンチ" indicated on it, at a collection point.</li> <li>Nickel-cadmium batteries and button batteries should be disposed of after they have been insulated (plastic tape pasted over the electrodes).</li> <li>Put naked fluorescent tube (include bulb-styled) and disposable lighters in container specified at a collection point.</li> <li>Broken fluorescent tubes are to be put into plastic bags (clear if possible) etc., and disposed of in a container.</li> </ul>

\* Please dispose of in the prescribed manner in accordance with the law.

**Articles not collected:**

- Tyres and wheels
- Gas cylinder
- Paint (with contents inside)
- Agrochemical and its container
- Battery
- Soil, Stones, Soil for gardening
- Waste oil (mineral oil, kerosene, gasoline and other oil)
- Multiple vinyl film for agricultural use
- Oil heaters
- Blocks, bricks, tiles
- Tatami

**CAUTION**

- When bringing garbage directly to the incineration site, please bring your driver's license or other proof of identity for identification purposes.
- Please separate your garbage even when you bring it directly.
- Bulky trash (furniture) is accepted at the incineration plant and then transported to the final disposal site for general waste.
- Household garbage is collected "free of charge", but general waste from businesses is "charged", so please consult with the incinerator plant.
- Industrial waste will not be collected and disposed of by the town; please contact an industrial waste disposal company.
- For medical waste, please contact the medical institution where you receive treatment for information on how to dispose of it.
